## Guidelines to Authors

The **Journal of Plant Resources** is an annual scientific publication of the Department of Plant Resources (DPR), Thapathali and publishes articles on plant sciences mainly focus in taxonomy, systematic botany, ethnobotany, phytochemistry, pharmacology, micorbiology, and biotechnology, biochemistry, analytical chemistry, Climate change, Conservation biology. The Editorial Board reserves all the rights for acceptance or rejection of paper submitted. It may alter or modify the style of presentation wherever necessary. The manuscript submitted should not be previously submitted for publication elsewhere. The Journal of Plant Resources will accept the following contributions:

*Original research articles and review paper:* It should include Title, Abstract, Keywords, Methods and Materials, Results and Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgements and References. Paper submitted for publication should not exceed more than 10 printed pages for original articles, 15 printed pages for review papers (including Tables, Figures and Illustrations).

*Short communication:* It should include Abstract and References. The length of paper should not more than 2 printed pages including References.

**The authors are requested to prepare their manuscripts in Times New Roman following the guidelines and submit manuscript** in word 2003-2007 in electronic version **to the managing editor via [info@dpr.gov.np](mailto:info@dpr.gov.np) or [panthi.sishir@gmail.com](mailto:panthi.sishir@gmail.com).**

**1. Language:** The Journal language is American English.

**2. Title of paper (first heading)** should be informative and concise with each first word capital letter, bold letter and 14 font.

The title should include:

The name (s) of the author (s), font 10, bold

The affiliation (s) and address (es) of the author(s), font 10, bold

The e-mail address of the corresponding author, font 10, bold, italics

**3. Abstract:** the font size should be 10 and bold. Word count for abstract should not exceed 250 words. The abstract should not contain any undefined abbreviations or references.

**4. Keywords:** the font size should be 10 and italics. Please provide 4 to 6 keywords arranged in alphabetical order. The keywords should not be from title.

**5. Typeface and font size**

- Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgements, and References (second headings) should be 12 font size and bold.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> heading should be 12 point normal.
- 4<sup>th</sup> heading should be 12 point italics bold.
- 5<sup>th</sup> heading should be 12 point normal indent.
- The font size should be 12 points throughout the text including page numbers.
- The Scientific names should be in italics with authority (in normal).
- Use Tab stops or other commands for indents, not the space bar.
- Equations and formulae should be preferably typed in 12 point font size.

**6. Tables and Figures:**

- Should appear in the text closely following the point where it is discussed.
- The table number and table caption should be placed above the body of the table.
- The figure number and the caption should be placed below the figure.
- The text font size in the table and figure should be 10. Photos in JPG.  
Example: **Figure 1(Bold):** ..... (Title/caption: Not bold)  
**Table 1(Bold):** ..... (Title/caption: Not bold)
- Figure and table numbering must be continuous throughout the manuscript.

**7. Spacing:**

- Spacing throughout body of text : 1.5 spacing
- Spacing for references: 1.5 spacing *within* each entry but double spacing *between* each entry.
- Spacing for table of contents, list of tables and figures or illustrations: single spacing.

**8. Reference and Citation in the Text:**

The list of references should only include works that are cited in the text. References list should be alphabetical order by the last name of the first author of each work. The references should be arranged in alphabetical with chronological order by last name of the author. American Psychological Association (APA) format should be followed for references and citations in the text. Use hanging indents. Style of writing the references and citations in APA format are given below.
